COMPLAINING

Complaining can be seen as a natural human trait/phenomenon. It is often a response to problems or a way to communicate frustration or disappointments. Sometimes, however, we find ourselves wondering if we complain too much or are we making something out of nothing. In such cases, knowing how to stop complaining can help one to manage stress in more adaptive ways. I recall a story that was told to me – There once was a wise man that stood among a group of people who were complaining about the same issues over and over again. One day, instead of listening to the complaints, he told them a joke and everyone laughed. Then, the man repeated the joke. A few people smiled. Finally, and in his wisdom, the man repeated the joke a third time—but no one reacted. The man smiled and said, "You won't laugh at the same joke more than once. So, what are you getting from continuing to complain about the same problem?"

Needless to say - like the folks in this story we're not going to get anywhere if you keep complaining about the same problems or situations in our lives but do nothing to fix them. A common biblical passage that addresses complaining is Philippians 2:14-15, which encourages believers to "*do everything without complaining or arguing, so that you will prove yourselves to be blameless and innocent, children of God above reproach in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation.*"

This passage emphasizes the importance of a positive attitude and living a life that reflects the love of God, even in difficult circumstances. Another relevant passage is from Numbers 11:1, where the Israelites are shown complaining about their food and God's response to their discontent. Yes – It's probably not realistic for any of us to decide never to complain again, however, setting limits can be beneficial. So let us try not to focus on complaining, expecting other people to continue to react to our complaints. Instead, take action to make a change, recognizing that God is always with us in the good times and the bad.





From the Archives



THE 1919 ST GEORGE'S QUILT

After the decision was made to build the present day St. George's Memorial Church, there were many and various efforts made to raise funds. One woman, Mrs Leach, decided to make a quilt on which parishioners could have their name embroidered at the cost of ten cents a name. This quilt has been preserved in the archives of the church and it is in excellent condition despite the fact that it is 106 years old.

The quilt consists of 29 star-like structures with each one containing 6 names, one on each of the arms of the star. There are also five half stars that contain three names. In the centre of the quilt are the words "St George's Church Rev C R de Pencier Oshawa Ont 1919".

Some of the quilt stars contain the names of the whole family with the sixth arm of the star being just the word "family". I presume that the family still had to pay ten cents for this word being added. Most of the stars are just a random selection of names. There are some names that are on the quilt more than once so they must have contributed several times.

Below is a list of the names that are on the quilt. They are shown as they are grouped on the quilt. Not all the names were easily transcribed so there may be some names that are spelled incorrectly because it was not easy to read some of the embroidered letters. Perhaps as you peruse the list you may find names of your ancestors or names familiar to you because of past relationships.



Restoration of the Church

Our church renovations/restorations continue! Scaffolding is almost fully set up! The cleaning/restoring of walls and pillars will start this week! Drywallers are working on both gallery and vestry stairwells to repair and replace damaged ceiling and walls. When all work is complete, new carpets will be put on the stairs!

Organ Restoration Project

Our **Organ Restoration Project** began in February of 2023. We were quoted the following for each of the 4 divisions:

Swell	\$65,535 + HST
Great	\$59,150 + HST
Positiv	\$35,5235 + HST
Pedal	\$38,335 + HST

We had a wonderful start by completing the full restoration, cleaning and re-leathering of the **Swell Division!** Thanks SO MUCH to all who contributed!

Our plan was to move forward with a division each year if possible. With the **Great Division** being removed and re-installed in connection with the insurance claim, we would like to take advantage of this opportunity to restore, clean and re-leather that division while the pipes are at the Alan T. Jackson and Company's shop. The cost of this restoration would only be **\$26,122 + HST**. We have just over \$9,000 in our Organ Restoration account at this point. Special thanks to prior donations and our Good Friday Concert proceeds of \$2720 last weekend! **We are looking for another \$17,000 to top that up!** Specific donations toward the Organ Restoration Fund would be gratefully accepted if you are interested in and able to contribute!

We are TRULY fortunate to have such an incredible WELL OVER 1 MILLION DOLLAR instrument at our fingertips! Maintaining it is not only our responsibility but will continue to allow St. George's unique revenue opportunities moving forward! We thank you in advance for any assistance you can offer!
