Greetings everyone!

It was lovely to see so many of you at the recent clergy conference and the third Lift Up Our Hearts service, held at All Saints, Whitby. For those of you who picked up the prayer resources from Thy Kingdom Come, and the Prayer Through the Ages compilation, I hope your people are finding them encouraging.

Update about the Season of Spiritual Renewal

- Prayer will be facilitated by Dean Stephen Hance. This workshop will include an interesting panel discussion on the spiritual life of choirs. The panel will include Tom Bell, Choir Director at St. James Cathedral, former Primate Linda Nicholls, and Swee-Hong Lim, liturgist, hymn writer, and Professor of Sacred Music at Emmanuel College. Come explore some ideas on how to further develop the spiritual life of your choir or worship band.
- Through the fall we will be offering several **single-session online workshops**, including ones focused on: the relationship between hospitality and spiritual renewal in a church, learning from the conversion stories of Scripture, and evangelistic preaching. Watch for registration details coming soon.
- This fall we will also be offering some **multi-session online courses**, including two evening courses. One of these will focus on how the Rule of St. Benedict can enrich our lives today. The other will lead participants through the discipleship program Christian Foundations. We'll also be offering a daytime series based on the program Everyday Witness, which helps people share their faith with others.
- Our **two final Lift Up Our Hearts services** will be held at St. James, Orillia (September 27th) and St. Paul's, Bloor Street (October 25th). Both worship gatherings will take place at 2 pm and will be followed by refreshments and time to connect with people from across our diocese.
- Finally, watch for details about another **Advent for Everyone** program, an evening on-line teaching and worship series led by our bishops.

From the Archives



THE 1919 ST GEORGE'S QUILT

After the decision was made to build the present day St. George's Memorial Church, there were many and various efforts made to raise funds. One woman, Mrs Leach, decided to make a quilt on which parishioners could have their name embroidered at the cost of ten cents a name. This quilt has been preserved in the archives of the church and it is in excellent condition despite the fact that it is 106 years old.

The quilt consists of 29 star-like structures with each one containing 6 names, one on each of the arms of the star. There are also five half stars that contain three names. In the centre of the quilt are the words "St George's Church Rev C R de Pencier Oshawa Ont 1919".

Some of the quilt stars contain the names of the whole family with the sixth arm of the star being just the word "family". I presume that the family still had to pay ten cents for this word being added. Most of the stars are just a random selection of names. There are some names that are on the quilt more than once so they must have contributed several times.

The following pages show the list of the names that are on the quilt. They are shown as they are grouped on the quilt. Not all the names were easily transcribed so there may be some names that are spelled incorrectly because it was not easy to read some of the embroidered letters. Perhaps as you peruse the list you may find names of your ancestors or names familiar to you because of past relationships.

Project Update


We're making progress!

Our plans for the new elevator /lift and parish hall renovations are moving forward!

We have received the 60% submission project report from our Architect, BBA (Barry Brian and Associates)

We have \$619,000 left over from the sale of Cowan House. We anticipate the budget for the project to be close to \$1,000,000. We are in the process of applying for some grants from the Diocese to help fund the remainder of the project.

Organ Restoration Project

Our **Organ Restoration Project** began in February of 2023. We were quoted the following for each of the 4 divisions:

 \$38,335 + HST


We had a wonderful start by completing the full restoration, cleaning and re-leathering of the **Swell Division**! Thanks SO MUCH to all who contributed!

Our plan was to move forward with a division each year if possible. With the **Great Division** being removed and re-installed in connection with the insurance claim, we would like to take advantage of this opportunity to restore, clean and re-leather that division while the pipes are at the Alan T. Jackson and Company's shop. The cost of this restoration would only be **\$26,122 + HST**. We have just over \$9,000 in our Organ Restoration account at this point. Special thanks to prior donations and our Good Friday Concert proceeds of \$2720 last weekend! **We are looking for another \$17,000 to top that up!** Specific donations toward the Organ Restoration Fund would be gratefully accepted if you are interested in and able to contribute!

We are TRULY fortunate to have such an incredible WELL OVER 1 MILLION DOLLAR instrument at our fingertips! Maintaining it is not only our responsibility but will continue to allow St. George's unique revenue opportunities moving forward! We thank you in advance for any assistance you can offer!


