Scale Tales

Keeping warm in Canada in the winter and longer, means layering with warm clothing, like sweaters and jackets. This has secondary value in that all the clothes hide a variety of bulges and imperfections! Then summer appears, and the first time we don shorts and a tank top, or a bathing suit, we look in the mirror and say, "Oh my!"

Keeping a healthy weight is a challenge for most people. While we have come to understand and accept that there are many different 'body types,' which generally refers to natural body shape, muscle composition and bone structure, we still realize the importance of staying within certain guidelines related age, height and general health. Some advocate for using body Mass Index (BMI as a better guide than just the scales. The formula is easy to find online.

There are several good weight loss programs, which offer the advantage of individual counselling, and group support and encouragement. When all is said and done, it comes down to this: calories from food, and calories from exercise. Burn more calories than we eat, and we lose weight. Eat more calories that we burn, and we gain weight!

For example, there are approximately 60 calories in a Timbit. To burn off 60 calories, you would have to walk briskly for 15 minutes! Eating well is choice we must make dozens of times a day. A balance of healthy diet and adequate exercise provides us with longer, stronger, better lives. It's a long term decision we all must make for ourselves.








We're in the home stretch!

Restoration of the Church - Update

We're getting closer!! Here's where we're at as of July 18th:

- restoration work in the main church is almost complete!
- scaffolding is being removed
- stair well carpets will be removed and replaced once interior cleaning is complete
- exterior windows are being caulked
- the 'Great Division' of the organ will be returned
- the full organ will be cleaned and tuned

THE CHURCH WILL BE 'WEDDING READY' BY AUGUST 1st!

Reminder that this restoration work is being completed and paid for through an insurance claim (#1) re water ingress pre-roof restoration. It is totally separate from the Parish Hall Renovation Project.










Insurance Claim #3 - Update

We are very pleased to report that Insurance Claim #3, opened August 2024 is finally coming to a close!! The property incurred damage as a result of a 'break and enter'. (triple glass doors broken, kitchen windows broken, stonework outside the kitchen windows damaged)

The scope of work was large and weather played a role in completing the repairs in a more timely fashion HOWEVER they are now DONE! Pics below show the kitchen windows being replaced!

Project Update

We're making progress!

Our plans for the new elevator /lift and parish hall renovations are moving forward!

The motion (see below) from the Special Vestry Meeting held July 6th was passed unanimously. Thank you to everyone who turned out for this meeting and offered your valuable input.

Special Vestry Motion for the second phase of our Parish Improvement Project at St. George's Memorial Church, Oshawa

Whereas, the Corporation of St George's Memorial Church, Oshawa has proposed a Parish Improvement Plan, the second phase of which encompasses renovations to the upper and lower parish hall, installing an accessible washroom in the upper hall, installing a lift (LULA lift) to access all levels of the lobby and hall and refurbishing the Centre Street lobby.

Whereas during the Vestry Meeting held on July 6, 2025, comprehensive documentation regarding the proposed project was duly presented and reviewed;

Now, therefore, be it resolved that St George's Memorial Church:

- 1. Commits to initiating Phase 2 of the Parish Improvement Project as described herein;
- 2. Allocates a budget not to exceed \$1,310,433.00
- 3. Plans to finance the project via funds remaining from the sale of our Cowan House Property and Funding Sources from the Diocesan Baker Fund and Ministry Allocation Fund.
- 4. Undertakes to proceed with the project in accordance with the Anglican Diocese of Toronto's Canon 6 approval process for building or structural alterations; and,
- 5. Ensures that the project execution will be subject to a competitive procurement process, aimed at securing the best value for money.

Motion Moved By: Earl Wotton Seconded By: Wendy Bott

In favor: all (54) Opposed: none

Motion was carried unanimously.

We have received the 90% submission project report from our Architect, BBA (Barry Brian and Associates).

We have approximately \$600,000 left over from the sale of the Cowan House property (corner of Athol and Mary Streets). We anticipate the budget for the project to be approximately \$1,300,000. We have submitted applications to the Diocesan Ministry Allocation Fund and the Baker Fund for the remaining funds.



Organ Restoration Project

Our Organ Restoration Project, which began in February of 2023 continues on! The project is HUGE financially! It is our privilege to own such a beautiful instrument but with that privilege comes the responsibility of maintaining it. This incredible instrument is not only used in church services but has been featured in concerts, festivals and recitals, helping to increase revenue for the church. Many thanks to those who have already supported this project! Here's where we're at:

Projected Cost per Division (section of the organ) and Status

• Swell \$65,535 + HST - **COMPLETE**

Positiv \$35,523 + HST - future
 Pedal \$38,335 + HST - future

• Great \$59,150 + HST - in progress - see below

Insurance claim #1 re water ingress pre-roof restoration will cover a portion of this Division as they had to remove pipes to access damaged wall areas.

\$26,122 + HST remains to be covered.


\$10,699 is in our 'Organ Restoration Fund' account currently

Financial Update

A Message on Giving

As members of God's family, we are entrusted with the gifts He has generously given us. At St. George's, we strive to be a caring and compassionate community—sharing those gifts generously to support and uplift those in need.

Did You Know...?

- It costs the church approximately \$400,000 each year for clergy, staffing, utilities, music, insurance, and diocesan fees (55,000). This means we must raise \$400,000 annually (153 identified donors) from our congregation just to keep the lights on.
- If you place your weekly donation in an envelope with your **name and address**, you will receive a **tax receipt at the end of the year**, which provides a tax incentive on your return.

Financial Update (June 2025)

Here is an update on our financial picture as of the end of June 2025. The chart below provides an overview of our actual revenue and expenses compared to our budgeted revenue.

- Our annual revenues are currently \$22,100 below budget
- Our expenses are \$4,600 over budget
- This means our budget is off by \$26,700
