## A Message from Rajini

### Preparing for Lent

As I was taking down the decorations from the Christmas tree, a thought crossed my mind: What comes next? As we pack away the joy and celebration of the Christmas season, I felt a gentle nudge to prepare myself for the next sacred and busy season—the season of Lent.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, six weeks before Easter, and is observed for forty days, excluding Sundays, leading us to Easter. I recall a conversation we had around this time last year when a colleague asked, "What are you planning to give up for Lent?" As we went around the table, one person said alcohol, another said meat, and another mentioned sweets. As I listened, I found myself asking: What is the true meaning of Lent, and what is God inviting us to do during this important season? Lent is a season set apart for prayer, reflection, repentance, and almsgiving. It is a time when we journey toward a deeper understanding of the suffering, death, and sacrifice of Jesus, as we prepare our hearts for the joy of Easter.

In the early Christian era, new believers were baptized during the Easter Vigil or on Easter Sunday. In preparation, the candidates and their families were asked to fast for forty days, mirroring Jesus' forty days of fasting in the wilderness. Over time, this practice developed into various forms of fasting and spiritual discipline observed before Easter.

As we approach the season of Lent, let us ask ourselves: How will this Lent draw us closer to God? What can we do to be renewed and transformed into the people God calls us to be? What spiritual disciplines can we embrace to foster repentance, deepen our faith, and walk more closely with our Creator? What acts of mission can we undertake to show Christ's love to our neighbours? What sacrifices can we make in penitence as we seek to understand more deeply the sacrifice of Christ?

As we enter this sacred season, let us prayerfully reflect on how Lent can draw us closer to God. Let us invite the Holy Spirit to speak into our hearts, guiding us toward repentance, renewal, and transformation. There are many resources available to support us during this season—apps, books, daily devotions, special Lenten services, Bible studies, and sermons offered online, in our parish, and throughout the diocese. I encourage each of you to seek out the resources that best fit your spiritual journey and to engage with them intentionally, so that you may experience Lent more fully. Lent is a time to examine our hearts with humility and to reflect on all that God has done for us. It is also a time to come together as a community, seeking ways to serve and support our neighbours. May we surrender ourselves fully to God and open our lives to the work he longs to do in and through us during this holy season.

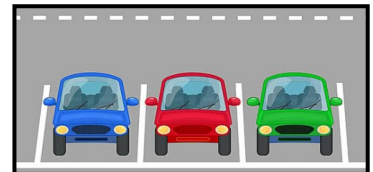


## Tax Receipts

## Blue Box Recycling Program

In Ontario, as of January 1, 2026, places of worship (churches), along with other businesses and non-profits, are considered "non-eligible sources" for municipal blue bin collection.

What does this mean for St. George's?

### **THE CANDELABRAS**



The photo on the left shows one of the two beautiful candelabras that for many years stood on either side of the altar in St. George's Memorial Church. The two candelabras now reside in the Archives.

The candelabras were purchased in Cairo, Egypt by Mr. and Mrs. F. W. Cowan and were given to the church in the 1920's as part of the furnishing of the sanctuary. They are over six feet tall and are covered in a gold-coloured brass filigree. The candles on the top are electric and it is unclear as to whether they were originally wax candles.

In 1982, the candelabras were removed to make room for Christmas trees that were in the sanctuary and were not immediately returned to their place at the altar. There were complaints from some of the parishioners and after much discussion it was decided to return them to the sanctuary.

However in 1995 there were complaints that the candelabras were not appropriate to be in a Christian church since they contained fragments of scripts that referred to Allah. The wardens had an expert examine the candelabras and he reported that there were several renditions of the expression "Allahu akbar" (God is greater), an expression that is also contained on the flag of Iraq. In his opinion the candelabras were probably made for a pious Muslim to be used in a home rather than a place of worship since Muslims have no ornamentation in mosques. He stated that it was incongruous and sacrilegious to both faiths to have these as a focal point of the celebration of the Christian sacrament.

The candelabras were removed from the sanctuary and placed in the archives. There were attempts made to give the candelabras to the local mosque but since they do not allow ornamentation in their place of worship, they could not accept them. There were also attempts made to sell them but there were no buyers. The Oshawa Community Museum is interested in acquiring them but until they have more storage space, they remain in the archives.
